QUALIFYING FOR NB-PEI REGIONAL DRESSAGE CHAMPIONSHIPS (INTRODUCTORY, TRAINING, FIRST LEVEL, SECOND LEVEL):

- The competitor must have a score of at least 58% on two different technical tests (e.g., Test 1 and 2) in the division they are competing in at Regional (EC Dressage or Eventing Tests from sanctioned shows or test scores from the NB-PEI Regional Qualifying Shows at HRC on July 14th and August 11th). Tests to be submitted with Regional Championship registration.
- **No qualifying scores required to participate in the Introductory Division.**

NB-PEI REGIONAL DRESSAGE CHAMPIONSHIPS:

- Tests may NOT be called. Riders must have them memorized.
- The 20x40 ring shall be used for Introductory and Training levels.
- The 20x60 ring shall be used at First Level and above.
- Any competitor receiving a score less than 40% shall be eliminated from the class. Any score less than 50% on any technical test is not eligible for the class placing or awards.
- Two technical tests will be required in each division. To be named Champion and Reserve Champion, competitor must have no score under 50% and an average score over 58% in the two technical tests to be named Champion and an average score over 56% to be named Reserve Champion. Should there be only one entry in any class, placings shall be awarded in accordance with the score achieved.
- The EC tests are available on the Equestrian Canada website: www.equestrian.ca/sport/dressage/tests.
- A Safety Officer and official Show Steward will be on-site. Safety tack check by the Safety Officer is mandatory before entering the warm-up ring. The official tack check (for legal tack as per CPC Dressage Rules) will take place after the class. Either tack check may disqualify a competitor.
- At Regionals, a horse/rider combination may enter a maximum of two consecutive levels/divisions. One horse may be ridden by two riders; but may not cross over levels/divisions with one rider (i.e., rider A rides at the lower level, rider B rides one level higher).
- A turnout rubric can be found on page 4. Each box is to be marked out of a potential 10 points. To ensure fairness, the same judge will mark turnout for all riders. All grooming and turning out (braiding, tacking up, spot fixes, boot polishing, etc.) **MUST** be completed by a pony club groom or the competitor themselves. NO PARENTS OR ADULTS are to be in the barn helping the rider prepare for their tests/turnout prior to competition. If organizers find out/see that an adult has helped the competitor prepare their horse or themselves, the rider will be docked points in the turnout category.
- **Scoring per division will be as follows: First Ridden Test (40%) + Second Ridden Test (40%) + Turnout for Rider and Horse (20%).** The rider with the highest combined score per division will be the Regional Dressage Division Champion. The Training and First Level Division Champions have the option of attending the next CPC National Dressage Championships (Second Level as well if National Championship offers that Division). Reserve Champions will have second refusal to participate in the next National Championships.
- The Regional Dressage Chair has the authority to cancel a competition for any number of reasons (weather, finances, and lack of entries). Cancellation must be announced a minimum of 48 hours before the scheduled start of competition.

QUALIFYING FOR NATIONAL DRESSAGE CHAMPIONSHIPS:

- Qualifying candidates for the CPC National Dressage Championships must meet the following criteria: Be Regional Champions in Training Level and above; be 13 years of age or over as of January 1 of the competition year; and have obtained a D1 level or higher as of the due date of the application for the National competition.

- b) the unpredictability of an equine’s reaction to such things as sounds, sudden movement, tremors, vibrations, unfamiliar objects, persons or other animals and hazards such as subsurface objects; and,
- c) the potential for other participants to behave in a negligent manner that may contribute to injury to themselves or others, including failing to act within their abilities to maintain control over an equine.

2) I acknowledge that I am participating at my own risk and in full knowledge of the hazards and potential hazards inherent in this activity as well as the inherent risks of riding or being around horses including bodily injury and/or property damage resulting from normal use, competition, or schooling.

3) In addition to consideration given for my participation in _____, being held at _____, on the _____ day/s of 202____, I and my heirs, executors, administrators and assigns agree:

- To Waive All Claims that I might have against the Organizing Committee, the Canadian Pony Club and its affiliated clubs, as well as their directors, officers, agents, representatives, employees, officials, members, volunteers and the owners or occupiers of the land(s) upon which the competition/activity is held (all of them collectively hereinafter referred to as the "HOST"); and
- To Release the “HOST” from Any and All Liability for any loss, damages, injury, or expense that I or my “Legal Representatives” might suffer as a result of my Participation due to any cause whatsoever including any NEGLIGENCE ON THE PART OF THE “HOST”; and
- To HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNIFY THE “HOST” from any and all liability for bodily injury or property damage to any third party which might result from my Participation.
